Fellowship Objective

This fellowship is designed to provide ophthalmologists with hands-on training in Small Incision Cataract Surgery (SICS) and Phacoemulsification. Additionally, participants will benefit from practical wet lab sessions ensuring a comprehensive and skill-enhancing learning experience.

Highlights of the Fellowship

- Duration: 18 Months
- Optimal wet lab facility for trainees equipped with Alcon Laureate Phacoemulsification Machine.
- Exposure to high end investigation equipment (Heidelberg Spectralis OCT, IOL Master 500, B scan, Perimetry, Specular Microscopy, Fundus Photo, VEP, ERG)
- Hands on Yag-Capsulotomy (Zeiss VisulagYag III)
- Surgeries are supervised by senior instructors until surgeon gains confidence to perform independent surgeries.
- Post-operative review of the cases done by senior consultants.
- Every training case is recorded and discussed at the end of the session for better recall and fine tuning of techniques.
- Surgeons are provided with the recording of their cases to review each step after hospital hours.

- One on one discussions on topics like biometry, dealing with complicated cases, Yag Capsulotomy, Newer IOLs etc.
- Optional 6-month extension at the end of fellowship in Advanced Phacoemulsification fellowship.
- Optional opportunity for consultant post interview at the Sheth M. L. Vaduwala Charitable Eye Hospital and Dr. Thakorbhai V. Patel Eye Institute provided a total of 2-year fellowship is completed.
- Final Certification will be provided for 18-month fellowship as well as extended fellowships by the institute. Surgeons completing the fellowship will be awarded with FTVPEI credentials for their achievement.

Responsibilities of an Anterior Segment Fellow

- OT timings 6:30 am to 12:30 pm.
- OPD timings 9:00 am to 5 pm with a 45-minute Lunch break.
- Surgeons are expected to see OPD during hospital hours and rotate in turns between OT and Wetlab without compromising the OPD.
- Surgeons are to prepare monthly presentations and conduct seminar discussions on the above topics.
- Surgeons are expected to be on 24-hour duty calls on rotational basis. Monthly Duty Rota will be prepared by senior fellows and will be approved by administration.
- Senior Fellows are supposed to guide junior fellows in surgery and OPD management.

Optional Extended Advanced Phacoemulsification Fellowship

- Fellows are eligible to opt for this fellowship in continuation after completing their 18-month fellowship.
- Interview will be taken for this fellowship; fellow will be evaluated on their previous performance and log book records. Administration will have the final decision regarding appointing the fellow for this advanced fellowship.
- Objective of this fellowship is to train fellows to become independent private practitioners in future with its focus on management and intellectual skills along with dealing with complex cataract cases.
- Surgeons will be exposed to operate on Paid cases and will be trained in counselling skills.
- Surgeons will be trained to do phacoemulsification on cataracts like sclerotic, brownblack, pseudoexfoliation, hyper-mature, phacomorphic, traumatic, small pupil, microphthalmos, coloboma, subluxated lenses, etc.
- Exposure to Implant premium IOLs like TORIC, Multifocals, EDOF, etc. and see premium OPD cases simulating a private practice environment.

- Qualified Ophthalmologist with MS / DNB degree from recognized university.

- Starting Date: Flexible, Will be decided on interview.

- 18-month Fellowship: Rs. 20,000 / month
- Extended 6-month Fellowship: Rs. 40,000 / month
